

The People of Mission - Psalm 145 (23 May 2010)

1. In Psalm 145 and Acts 2, there is no real division between telling God how great he is and telling others how great God is. How can you include more of both in your daily life?
2. In the Pentecost story, it is the Holy Spirit that gives Peter and the disciples the power and courage to carry out their mission to tell the world about Jesus. How can you ensure you are being filled with the Spirit day by day? (Eph 5:18b)
3. God has given his people the mission of telling others about Him. How can you support each other in this mission?

The God of Mission - Psalm 115 (16 May 2010)

1. Verse 4-8 contrasts pagan idols with the living God; what material items, celebrities or modern day aspirations eclipse your vision of God?
2. The psalmist says that God is their help and shield. How far have you moved in trusting God rather than your own efforts/achievements to save protect and prosper you?
3. Tozer said "What I believe about God is the most important thing about me." How far is that true for you?
4. The psalmist says God is loving, faithful, protective and longs to bless us –ask him to reveal more of himself to you in the quiet of your prayers and your reading of the gospels.

The Great Commission - Make Disciples - Matthew 28:16-20
(2 May 2010)

1. Jesus says he has been given all authority on heaven and earth. What does that mean to you? How does it change the way you live your life?
2. Jesus last command to his disciples is to "go and make disciples". Who disciples you and who are you discipling?
3. In what ways does your heart revert back to its default mode of moralism? How do your fears and your pride to motivate you to do good things and to do bad things?
4. What are the areas of your life in which you need to apply the Gospel? In Paul uses the Gospel to encourage the Corinthians to be generous. In he uses the Gospel to encourage husbands to be faithful. How might you apply the Gospel to the issues you are currently wrestling with?
